When fireboard redirects the user automatically, it returns a wrong URL.

In my case it does:

http://www.crossyourborders.nl/index.php?option=com_fireboard&Itemid=136&func=view&catid=4&id=4676#4676

and it should be

http://www.crossyourborders.nl/index.php?option=com_fireboard&Itemid=136&func=view&catid=4&id=4676#4676

In my case it gives the default template back but I have assigned a specific one to the forum. After clicking on a link again it's goes back to the assigned template.

Need a quick fix of this bug, but I cannot find it. Please post fast.

Which returns the default template.

When the url is

Here's the a href code for the the manual link (from post.php):

When a user posts a reply it redirects and a page opens with:

Not Acceptable

An appropriate representation of the requested resource /joomla/index.php could not be found on this server.

The URL that gave an error page looked like this:

.../joomla/index.php?option=com_fireboard&Itemid=3&func=view&catid=3&id=6#6

When I remove the extra "amp;" from the URL and hit enter it works the way it should.

I already directed yesterday you to this post yesterday, where seems someone had a fix, and if not working, at least deactivation of the redirection:

Can't try as I can't reproduce on my local server :/ also seems it only happens with j1.5 series, so maybe is not only a fireboard bug ;) you must understand, that right now, fireboard in j1.5 does only run in legacy mode, that is not even close to perfect...

the .htaccess was modded so I've put it back
RewriteEngine on

and then on admin panel at "Global Configuration" > site> at SEO setting I enable "Use Apache mod_rewrite"

that do the trick for me now..

Turning redirection off:

edit the post.php file in the directory of the template you are using.

in the default template post.php line 419 and 441 (inside the script tags)

comment these lines (add // at the beginning of the line)

This disabled the automatic redirect for me and fixed the problem.
