
Fireboard 1.0.4 Nightly Developer Patch SVN#551

In order to be able to test some of the latest fixes with a broader audience I have put together a nightly build for a patch to 1.0.4

This is an unsupported patch to allow you to test the latest collection of fixes from the SVN #551.

The patch file is a zip archive that needs to be unzipped locally. It only contains those files that changed since 1.0.4. In order to patch a server, these files need to be ftp-ed/copied over the existing files. Needless to say you should backup first. This is for testing purposes only and not intended as an official patch or version.

This should fix all those bugs that got closed on the SVN over the past couple of days. As this is just a nightly build, no documentation is provided outside of this message. If you want to know what bugs should be fixed in here please check Tracker on the SVN and look for bugs closed between 12-24-2007 and 1-10-2008.

Please keep feedback to this nightly build to this thread ONLY!

This post is for those who are experiencing javascript issues (errors or conflicts) when using the latest "Frontpage Slideshow" module (v1.6) on Joomla! templates that heavily rely on Mootools (mainly the RocketTheme templates).

So, if you already have such a template and furthermore, if you have installed some other Joomla! or Mambo extension that uses Mootools as well, you can get javascript errors or conflicts. But wait! This is actually normal and it all depends on how Mootools works. You see, calling the Mootools library multiple times (not to mention calling different version of the Mootools library on the same template!) causes it to crash in many situations.

So what do we do? The best solution is to call the full Mootools library on your template's head.../head tags and comment it out/delete it from your extensions and your template.

That way you will only include the Mootools library once (=less weight for your webpage too) and all your Mootools-based extensions AND your template's "tools" or functionality will operate properly.

So download the full Mootools library

unzip it, create a folder called "js" inside your current template and transfer in there the extracted mootools.v1.11.js file. After that, add this code between the head.../head tags in your template:

I have gone to the browser tracker to check out what fixes are available since I upgraded to 1.04:

The only change I have done so far is the fix for quick reply boxes being open on every message.

Some of the trackers for issues I am concerned over say Fixed in or before SVN 551.

So I download the file for 551 but I am concerned about uploading all of them. I would upload one at a time if I knew what fix was being applied.

I know you said theres no documentation but I would like to apply a fix one at a time, or atleast know that I am replacing a file that fixes a particulr issue.

I don't mean to sound ungrateful, but it seemed like a shortcut to not post the fix in the tracker item vs directing a user to look elsewhere that isnt documented yet.

Many fixes are touching multiple files at once. It is simply not possible to keep track at that level - outside of SVN. The SVN contains that info for developers and advanced users but there is absolutely nothing planned to make this available to a broader audience.

That's the one problem I still cannot reproduce. I have tried:

IE6 & 7, Firefox on Windows and Mac, Safari on Windows and Mac and a few other minor browsers. I wonder if this is a conflict with another template or jsript. Would somebody with this issue allow me to poke behind the scenes of their install?

As for the SVN: Every time a fix gets checked in a new SVN version gets created. Usually they are not made public until the next release but can be downloaded directly form SVN (joomla.org) but since there is no install it is not as easy for the average joe to test those. That's why I volunteered to package a nightly build. I will put together another one within the next couple of days or so, as several more issues have been fixed.

Would that count as a "bug"? The discrepancy/ies has/have been known of since the .4 release but it is unknown as to what the discrepancies are.

I did the reinstall on a live site with no issues since the database is never touched. Applied this SVN patch and have had no problems. I even updated the JQuery to the latest version for good measure.

I would urge everyone to not use the .4 upgrade patch files and just do a full reinstall (NOT a CLEAN INSTALL) and apply THIS patch after you have tested it out first. Of course BACKUP BACKUP BACKUP first.

Hum, i would rather report the bug in the patch files which create this side effect error has this would help to fix the patch files. Most of users won't come here and read your advice and so far it is the only problem i met with the patch files, in addition you should detail more explicitly what you call a full reinstall. In my mind reinstall goes along with image and template directory loss where it becomes annoying when you installed a custom template in which you did css modifications.

I mean if this is a recurrent problem a tutorial about performing what you call a full reinstall would help especially if linked in the wiki.

That is exactly what I mean by full reinstall. Backup anything you want to save (template folders, images, etc) uninstall FB, reinstall FB and reupload anything that was deleted by the uninstall. If you are unsure backup all your FB folders in their entirety.

Anyway this is a dirty workaround not a solution and may be a real pain for big sites, patch files are supposed to work and is what most users will use. As i said most users won't come here and eventually read your advice so most users may still have this issue if no one care to fix the patch files so advising this is good as a temp fix but not in the long run. That's why i'm more interested in finding what is wrong in the patch file package and fill the suitable bug report so that patch files package can be fixed and most users not impacted by this bug.

Keep in mind that most users won't browse the forum and they won't benefit your temp workaround so fixing the patch files is important and inescapable IMO. I'm not fine with letting fireboard 1.0.4 patch file users alone with their issues.

TWO THINGS...

First, what you folks are doing, and your approach is alright with me. You are working on it now, and its a work in progress. When its ready to go, the community can grab the release files. My gripe was that in the bugtracker it made it seem like a particular bug was FIXED because it was listed as CLOSED. In reality you guys are working on it so its not officially FIXED (just a work in progress with need to be tested fixes if any) and shouldnt be CLOSED if I understand it correctly.

LASTLY, this may or may not be something you can use... I understand the files did nothing to the database as you folks have documented. However on our website we use JACLplus for permissions. After we did the upgrade we started getting messages from users that they could not see the website forums. We as super admins saw all forums and didnt think at the time that anything was wrong. We noticed somehow the permissions had gotten hosed. All permissions in jacplus and for the forums needed to be reset. This may or may not be of interest to you but I did want to share it. 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As for the fixed bugs. Once we have a fix that has been validated by several folks, we close the bug. It means that the latest SVN contains that fix and that it will be part of the next release that gets put together. Ho great concept !, it seems really good that the max image size parameter is dependent of the max textarea width. I tested and it works as described in your post.

I think this way of handling things is really an improvement as it ensure that your forum layout is not destroyed by big images, it was the case in 1.0.3 on my forum and is fixed now (didn't noticed this before you told me).

The only additional thing i could see would be to make the image clickable so that the user can just click the image to see it in full size in a blank page (like when you right click on it and choose view image). Anyway i can live without, i find this new implementation way more appropriate than the previous which broke forum layout in some cases.

I have posted this a few times, for me the two most problematic issues of FB are:

A.)Big issue when it comes to latest discussions.

For exmple let's say I set time to show me latest discussions for only last 8h. Just for example.

- I pick a discussion that was created 1month ago, then reply something to it.

- After that I go to Discussions tab ...but I don't see my reply there even though my reply is only a few seconds old ...because tab looks for new replies only in topics that are 8h young I hope you get my point

Even BOJ had to change settings it seems, because it slowed the whole forum down and now Discussions shows only last week, but like I pointed out ...new replies to topics older then one week will not show. That makes Discussions tab really not a Recent discussions tab

So we would see really all discussions that someone replied to in last month or some other shorter time frame, even if the reply was for a discussion that is older then time frame set in all discussions tab.

B.) Second biggest issue is, take me to latest unread post function. It really is a problem when catching up while searching some multi-page thread you don't remember where was the last time you read it.

If you manage to make this work it will really be a big improvement, thank you for all your effort that has been done for the new patch, especially SEO improvement is more than welcome :)
